

The Arctic Circle is the most northerly of the five major circles of latitude as shown on maps of Earth. It marks the northernmost point at which the noon sun is just visible on the December solstice and the southernmost point at which the midnight sun is just visible on the June solstice.

The region north of this circle is known as the Arctic, and the zone just to the south is called the Northern Temperate Zone.

Adventures with snow and ice

The Arctic is a huge adventure playground, its snowy landscapes stretching from Norway's Russian border westwards to Greenland. This is more than a holiday it's a whole new experience. A visit to the Arctic in winter, is not simply about 'seeing' sights, it's about 'doing '- enjoying new experiences made possible because of the harsh climate and the snow and ice. It's also about learning local skills and enjoying traditions, which are centuries old. When your home is covered with snow and ice for the duration of the winter months, getting about in a husky sled, or on a snowmobile, or learning how to snowshoe is simply a way of life. We feel privileged to be able to offer you an insight into that way of life, and to introduce you to exhilarating new experiences.

These experiences are available in most of our destinations. In most cases, you can pick and choose the ones, which you find most enticing. You can be sure that we will only work with the best local partners to deliver the experiences, which will make your holiday special, and you can feel confident that we will always put your safety and security first. HUSKY SAFARIS

Meet the friendly huskies and learn how to mush your own sleigh, taking it in turns to drive in pairs. You can try husky mushing in any of our destinations but those who want to try a unique husky experience should look at our Spitsbergen Cabins and Canines experience on page 48.

SNOWMOBILE SAFARIS

Snowmobiling is a great way to cover a lot of ground relatively quickly, from hills to forests, vast wilderness landscapes to frozen lakes, snowmobiles can cover all types of terrain. You'll be given full instruction but you'll need to be over 18 and in possession of a full driver's licence to drive yourself. You can snowmobile in any of our destinations.

REINDEER SLEDDING

There's something especially charming about the idea of riding in a sleigh pulled by reindeer. Of course, if you want to meet the most famous of all of Lapland's reindeer, you'll need to book one of our Father Christmas experiences (contact us for details) but reindeer play an important role in Sami culture and can be visited all year round.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING AND SNOWSHOEING

These fun activities can be attempted in most of our destinations. Take some tips from the locals and give it a try – it will certainly keep you warm in the cold weather!

WHALE-WATCHING AND OTHER WILDLIFE

GREAT RAIL ADVENTURES

Travelling by train is a fantastic way to travel in comfort, surveying the scenery and navigating high mountains and deep valleys.

Enjoy one of the most northern railway journeys in the world, travelling along the shores of the Ofotfjord before heading to the Swedish border crossing of Riksansgransen, and through the Abisko National Park to the former mining town of Kiruna.

The Røros Railway - page 38

Travel the length of Norway by train, 383 kms from Oslo in the south to Trondheim in the north, through some of the country's most beautiful snowy landscapes.

A Winter Rail Odyssey in Fjord Norway - page 39

Take the Bergensbanen, Europe's highest railway, which links Oslo and Bergen, climbing to 4000 feet across the barren, snow-clad Hardangervidda mountain plateau and descending through sleepy valleys.

Visit the world's northernmost city of Spitsbergen, or the charming islands of the Lofoten archipelago.

You may wish to stay in a luxury lodge on the scenic shores of a fjord, or overnight in the spectacular snow hotel or an aurora cabin. However you choose to spend your time in this enthralling country, travelling through its dramatic landscape brings endless possibilities and very few know it as well as we do.

TROMSØ EXCURSION HIGHLIGHTS

NORTHERN LIGHTS

One of the big attractions of a stay in Tromsø is the possibility of witnessing the northern lights. We offer a number of different excursions to give you the best chance of seeing them. You can even take a Northern Lights Cruise. These are our most popular northern lights experiences:

NORTHERN LIGHTS SEARCH

This trip offers you the best possible chance of spotting the aurora. You will be picked up from central Tromsø and taken by an experienced guide, who will spend 6-8 hours with you taking you to different locations, avoiding light pollution, to track down the northern lights. You could go as far east as the Finnish border, or head north to a spot where the Atlantic is on one side and the Lyngen Alps on the other. Your guide will also help you take the best possible pictures of the northern lights. From: £125pp.

NORTHERN LIGHTS SPOTTING

This trip combines the chance to view the northern lights with a traditional Sami experience and takes around 4 hours. Escape the urban lights and travel out to the Tromsø Villmarkssenter, where you can lie on reindeer skins staring skywards, waiting for the northern lights to emerge. Grill sausages over a Sami Lavvo's open fire and sip hot berry juice. You also have the opportunity to visit the centre's husky kennels. For a supplement you can enjoy traditional reindeer stew 'bidos'. From: £105pp.

ARCTIC ACTIVITIES

We offer a full range of winter activities from snowshoe treks to cross-county skiing, snowmobile safaris to cruises. These are some of our most popular excursions but feel free to ask our knowledgeable staff or visit our website for a wider choice.

WILDERNESS REINDEER SLEDDING

Reindeer sledding is the oldest form of transport in the Arctic and an integral part of ancient Sami culture. This excursion takes 7 hours and you can choose whether to take this trip by day for the amazing views of the wild mountain scenery or by night for an opportunity to spot the northern lights. It includes a visit to a Lavvu, which is a traditional Sami tent, for lunch or dinner, where you will be introduced to the Sami history and way of life and have a chance to try lasso-throwing. WILDERNESS HUSKY SAFARI

Travel to Camp Tamok, a wilderness camp located in stunning uninhabited scenery, a picturesque 75 minute drive from Tromsø. You can choose whether to leave in the morning or late afternoon for this 7 hour trip, depending on whether you want to enjoy the views or have a chance to see the northern lights. Either way you will drive in pairs mushing your own team of huskies through the spectacular landscape. Enjoy a hot meal in a traditional Lavvu tent.






WHALE WATCHING AND WILDLIFE BY BOAT

Spend the day on board a comfortable cruiser in search of Orca and humpback whales and other wildlife. As you sail into the open sea keep an eye out for sea eagles and seals. You will leave first thing in the morning and spend 3-6 hours at sea. You will be accompanied by an English-speaking guide and transfer to Ersfjord or Sommarøy. Protective clothing, tea, coffee and an Arctic style lunch is included.

Artificial light pollution is minimal here and knowledgeable guides will lead you to wherever the aurora activity seems strongest. You will head off into the wilderness, stopping to enjoy a hot snack and coffee served by an open fire. If you don't manage to see the aurora, you will retire whilst your guides continue to search, rousing you if it does appear.

DAY 4 Choose one of our optional excursions or simply spend the day relaxing, enjoying the tranquil setting, or perhaps soaking in a hot tub. Either way you are sure to fall in love with the dramatic landscape.

DAY 5 **Return to the UK.**

Depending on the time of your return flight to the UK, choose whether to spend some time in Tromsø or to enjoy the day in the Malangen Resort before being transferred back to the airport for your flight home.



Fly high up into the Arctic Circle to Tromsø and turn your stay into 'An Arctic Night to Remember' with two nights in the city and an overnight at Camp Tamok in the Vass valley. Mush huskies, search out moose trails, ice-fish and snowmobile across snow white tundra. Sleep under a canopy of Arctic stars in a hot spot known to deliver a better than average sightings of the aurora.

YOUR ACCOMMODATION

CAMP TAMOK

Located outside of Tromsø amongst lofty mountains, fjords and the Lapland tundra, Camp Tamok is a wilderness experience like no other and is an ideal setting for snowmobile, husky and ice-fishing activities. It is well away from any light pollution and known for its dry climate and clear sky, maximising your chances of seeing the northern lights.

You have a choice of three types of accommodation:

THE WILDERNESS CABIN

Comprised of four bedrooms and two loft rooms accommodating up to 12 guests. The cabin is heated by a wood stove and lit by oil lamps thus offering a warm and a cosy place for a restful night's sleep.

SAMITENT

A traditional lavvu accommodating up to 12 people, where you will sleep in your own berth in a winter sleeping bag on top of several reindeer skins. Despite the open wood fires temperatures can drop to zero.

AURORA CABIN

This is the most private and romantic accommodation, ideal for couples. Heated but without water or electricity, you can lie in bed gazing out of the rooftop window for a chance to view the aurora.



Search the night sky for the aurora borealis and revel in the peace and tranquillity that the wilderness offers before retiring to your chosen accommodation.

DAY 3 Travel from Camp Tamok back to Tromsø.

After a hearty breakfast you will meet your Alaskan huskies. Mush in pairs and share the driving along a 15km trail through the mountainous and forested landscape of the Vass valley. Return to camp for lunch before transferring back to the Hotel With, where a light supper awaits.

DAY 4 Return to the UK.

Breakfast at leisure, and perhaps shop for some last minute treats, before taking 'Flybussen' to the airport in time for your return flight home.



This show-stopping journey transports you from Tromsø in Northern Norway, across the frozen tundra and mountain plateaus to Narvik, where you board The Arctic Train to Kiruna in Sweden. The tour ends with a spectacular stay at the ICEHOTEL. This flexible trip is in the heart of the aurora zone and allows you ample time to add Arctic excursions such as a northern lights hunt or husky, snowmobile and reindeer safaris. You can also extend your stay in any of the destinations featured.

Enjoy a plentiful breakfast before taking the early morning bus south to Narvik. The scenic 4-hour journey meanders through the glacial valleys and Fjords of Tromsø. On arrival check in to the Scandic Narvik and sample its designer delights. The rest of the day is at leisure. We recommend the Ofoten Museum, which chronicles the construction of the railway and the WWII battles for the control of Narvik's harbour and its all-important iron ore. Alternatively, take the cable car to the top of Narvikfjellet for panoramic views of Ofotfjord. Fine dining can be enjoyed at the Linken Restaurant. Since you are 250 miles north of the Arctic Circle, there is every chance of spotting the northern lights.

DAY 4 The Arctic Train & ICEHOTEL.

Board the Ofoten Line and Arctic Circle train for one of the most northern railway journeys in the world. The 3-hour journey initially hugs the shores of the Ofotfjord before ascending to its highest point at the Swedish border crossing of Riksangransen. There are no customs as you continue onwards crossing Abisko National Park before arriving at the former mining town of Kiruna.



DAY 5 Back to the UK.

Enjoy a warming hot berry juice and rejuvenating sauna before breakfast. Afterwards you will transfer to Kiruna Airport in time for your flight home to the UK (via Stockholm).

DAY 1 Fly from London to Tromsø.

On arrival, transfer to the Clarion Collection Hotel With and enjoy a light evening buffet supper.





Enjoy a day at leisure in this vibrant town. The Arctic and Polaria museums showcase the exploits of Polar Explorers Nansen & Amundsen and the Fjellheisen cable car to Mount Storsteinen offers a superb panoramic view of the surrounding landscape. Board your Hurtigruten ship for the late afternoon departure. Sail north along the fjord-indented coast towards Honningsvåg whilst enjoying a dinner sourced from Norway's natural coastal kitchen. Overnight on board.

DAY 3 Honningsvåg, North Cape and Mehamn.

On your arrival at Honningsvåg you disembark, travelling by bus, crossing the 71st parallel to the vertical cliffs of the North Cape. Labelled Europe's northernmost point (even though it isn't), the sheer rock face rises over 300m from the depths of the Arctic Ocean. There is time for photographic opportunities and a visit to the North Cape Hall, where you can enjoy a bite to eat.

Return to Honningsvåg to rejoin the ship in order to sail across Kjøllefjord where you disembark for a snowmobile safari across the Nordkyn peninsula. Remember to take a small overnight bag as you will be staying overnight in the tiny fishing village of Mehamn. Supper, sauna and overnight in a fjord-side Rorbu in the world's most northerly fishing village.

DAY 4 Kirkenes.

You will have time to savour this uniquely remote and rugged spot overlooking the Barents Sea before rejoining the Hurtigruten boat and cruising onwards to Kirkenes on the Norwegian/Russian border. Overnight on board.

DAY 5 Snowhotel Kirkenes.

Disembark and transfer to the Snowhotel Kirkenes - see page 32. After donning your protective thermal suits, you will be taken by snowmobile sledge to the edge of the frozen sea. Your driver/guide will help you draw up the pods containing the king crabs complete with their impressive 2-metre wide claw span. You will return to the quayside to cook and enjoy this delicacy. A welcome drink waits back at the Snowhotel before a 3-course supper. With luck you will catch the northern lights before retiring to your snow suite.

DAY 6 Back to the UK.


Snowhotel KIRKENES

At 69°N, the Snowhotel Kirkenes is the world's most northerly snow hotel. Located alongside the Langfjorden, 400km north of the Arctic Circle, it is at the apex of Scandinavia where Norway meets Russia and Finland. The resort boasts a wealth of facilities including a restaurant in a beautifully renovated barn, a bar and sauna. It has just 20 ice suites, ensuring an intimate, boutique ambience.

Intricately carved ice art designed by sculptors from around the world illuminate and adorn the public areas. Each ice room is a small treasure, which features double frame beds surrounded by ice blocks topped with thermal insulation and reindeer pelts.

The Snowhotel Kirkenes also offers 'Gamme Cabins' loosely based on the traditional Sami hunting and fishing huts that can be found in the wilderness. Developed in conjunction with Swiss architects, these strikingly simple private cabins offer under-floor heating, en suite Villeroy & Bosch bathrooms, and a separate seating area with aurora panoramic window. Ideal for romantics and those wanting an alternative to the cold accommodation.

DAY 1 Fly from London to Oslo.

Overnight stay at the Comfort Hotel Runway, Gardermoen Airport.

DAY 2 Snowhotel Kirkenes & Husky Safari.

As you approach, the enthusiastic barking signals the dogs' eagerness to get out on to the trail, but first you will be taught the basics of handling your team. Heading out into the surrounding wilderness you will be driving two to a sled, taking it in turns to mush. This 2 hour experience includes a wilderness lunch in a traditional Lavvu.

Returning to the Snowhotel you will be given a guided tour of your surroundings and a welcome drink. A delicious 3-course dinner comprised of the best local ingredients is served in the newly converted barn, complete with wonderful views of the surrounding landscape. Take time to pop outside and perhaps catch the northern lights before retiring to your ice suite and a night sleeping in a giant igloo at the very top of the world.

DAY 3 King Crab Safari.



Enjoy breakfast and a warm-up sauna before your transfer to the Thon Hotel Kirkenes for the next 2 nights. The remainder of the morning is at leisure. In the afternoon prepare for sightings of the sub aquatic albatross of the Barents Sea, a king crab resplendent with a 2-metre claw span.

You will be picked up by bus from the hotel. From Namndalen you will travel by snowmobile sledge to the edge of the ice. Your driver/guide helps you cut a hole in the frozen ocean and draw up the crab pods. You will transport your catch back to the quayside to cook and enjoy in a local fisherman's hut.

Return to the Thon Hotel late in the afternoon, with the remainder of your time at leisure.

DAY 4 Snowmobile Safari.



Enjoy a hearty breakfast before embarking on a 4 hour guided snowmobile tour. Driving in pairs, you will each have plenty of opportunity to steer and take photos along the way. A small picnic meal will be served en route. On returning to the hotel there is time for some well-deserved rest and relaxation.

DAY 5 Back to the UK.

LOFOTEN & THE AURORA

Lofoten has justifiably been described as one of the most scenic archipelagos in the world and in winter it can certainly be one of the most dramatic. It boasts spectacular glacial rock formations, which dominate the seascape, its clustered burgundy and white fishing hamlets clinging to the coastline. A long and rich cultural heritage dates back to the Vikings who settled in the region. It was also here that Joanna Lumley was filmed fulfilling her lifelong dream of witnessing the dancing hues of the aurora borealis. You will enjoy the opportunity to explore this beautiful region by land and sea.

Weather dependent there are plentiful hiking trails, as well as the ski centre at Røldal.





Fly to Svalbard, the northernmost airport in the world serviced by a scheduled airline, collect your husky dogs and head off with your guide for a three day mushing expedition into the polar wilderness. Days are spent immersed in this wild landscape that is home to the polar bear and previously the domain of hunters and trappers. Nights are spent in a comfortable, modern cabin as far away from civilisation as you can imagine.

SUGGESTED 6 DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1 Fly to Oslo.

Overnight Comfort Hotel Runway Gardermoen, Oslo Airport.

If conditions are favourable there is the chance to visit the isolated Russian mining town of Barentsburg, with a population of just 300. A last lunch will be served en route before returning to Longyearbyen to check in once again to the Basecamp Hotel.

ISFJORD RADIO

As its name suggests, Isfjord Radio is a former outpost for radio operators. It was built in 1933 and is only accessible by snowmobile or husky in the winter and boat in the summer. This once purely functional building, has been transformed into a 22 room boutique hotel. The resident chef delights in crafting Arctic menus of smoked seal, whale, halibut with roe butter, and reindeer sausage, most of which has been hunted by one of the three trappers left in Spitsbergen.

The rooms have sumptuous, comfortable beds and bathrobes. In addition to the dining room, there is a welcoming lounge and warming sauna. Shower and toilet facilities are shared. Incredible views come as standard and you may even glimpse a passing polar bear.





sweden LULEÅ

The beautiful archipelago of Luleå may be located just one hour's flight north from Stockholm but it is a world away in atmosphere, transforming during the winter months to a frozen wonderland. It is Sweden's northernmost county, at the heart of Swedish Lapland, just below the Arctic Circle.

Luleá's archipelago spans some 1,312 islands, many of them uninhabited, set in the brackish waters of the Bay of Bothnia. When it freezes over, it becomes a winter playground for spectacular Arctic adventures. The locals create an ice trail, linking the north and south harbours and surrounding the city, which is perfect for skating, walking and biking on specially adapted 'fat' bikes. There's no option but to do as the locals do, and revert to traditional modes of transport such as cross-country Nordic skis, husky sleds or kicksleds to explore the surrounding forests and mountains. More modern additions including snowmobiles and even hovercraft are also popular ways of getting around and exploring the beautiful scenery!

This is the perfect spot to view the northern lights and the expanse of glistening white snow often reflects the aurora overhead. The lively town is home to some of the region's best restaurants including the Biergo, where you can experience the Sami Story and Tasting Experience and Hemmagastronomi. Make sure you visit Gammelstad Church Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site, where the city was founded in 1621, with its 15th century church and atmospheric wooden houses.

YOUR ACCOMMODATION

BRÄNDÖN LODGE

This cabin village is set in front of a forest, deep with snow in the winter. The cottages are simple yet warm and stylish, each with 2 bedrooms, a kitchenette, lounge, bathroom and veranda overlooking the frozen sea. The main pinewood lodge houses a cosy bar and restaurant, where menus are based on locally-sourced produce. The facilities on hand are topped off by a lake-side sauna and bubble pool.

ARCTIC RETREAT

This eco-lodge has a back to nature feeling with delicious home cuisine and warm hospitality in a beautiful setting. Sheltered by large trees, the traditional and luxurious log cabins sleep up to 10 people in total in 3 traditional log cabins, all with private jacuzzi and sauna. Each cabin comes with its own deck complete with fire pit and hot tub. Bathrooms are small but perfectly formed, and products, such as lingonberry shampoo, are sourced from a nearby village. Dining at the Arctic Retreat is a communal affair (although there is the option to dine in your cabin if you prefer).

Your goal is Brändöskär, an idyllic 17th century fishing village situated the outer reaches of the archipelago. Here pack ice and snow can form 10m high barriers. Warming drinks and lunch are cooked over an open fire. Returning to Brändön Lodge, your afternoon is at leisure before dining in the main lodge.

DAY 3 Arctic Retreat & Northern Lights.

After breakfast, transfer to the Arctic Retreat. On arrival your guide will take you for a snowshoe walk and you will cook a delicious outdoor lunch. When you return, relax in the sauna and jacuzzi before enjoying a 3-course dinner. As darkness falls, your guide will take you on a drive or walk to a location where you will have the best chance of seeing the northern lights. If you are lucky enough to see them, you will get some tips on how to photograph this amazing phenomenon. You will enjoy a hot drink and some traditional Swedish Fika during the evening.

Today you have the option to head off with a team of huskies into the pristine wilderness or try an alternative excursion such as visiting a Sami family, or perhaps a Moose Safari. Your stay at the Arctic Lodge ends with a 3-hour extended dining experience. Local chef Richard Karlsson will introduce you to a new side of what the arctic food story is all about. You will travel through a variety of old and new techniques in cooking and preservation and learn about what makes the arctic cuisine so special. Served in the outdoors, by the fire, it will be a memorable end to your stay in Swedish Lapland.

DAY 5 Return to the UK.

Breakfast at your leisure before your transfer to the airport in time for your return flight back to the UK.

The first thing you see when flying into Luleå is a string of islands imprisoned in a frozen sea. In winter, boat traffic is replaced by snowmobiles, huskies and even cars driving across the metre thick ice. Brändön Lodge, a collection of 15 cottages, surveys this serene archipelago. It provides a comfortable and cosy retreat and the ideal base from which to explore the ice pack and the surrounding picturesque countryside. In this unpolluted wildemess the only street lights will be the glow of the northern lights as they dance across the sky.

SUGGESTED 4 DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1 Luleå Fly to Luleå (via Stockholm).

You will be picked up and transferred to Brändön Lodge, where a 3-course dinner will be served in the main lodge. Enjoy a digestif in the bar whilst keeping an eye out for the northern lights.

DAY 2 Snowmobile Pack Ice Tour.

After breakfast you will explore the unique features of this region with a 4-hour snowmobile tour. Travel across glistening ice and islands of the Luleå. archipelago. Your guide will tell you about life in the northern wilderness and you will get the opportunity to try ice-fishing. You will head to Brändöskär, an idyllic 17th century fishing village situated the outer reaches of the archipelago. Here pack ice and snow can form 10m high barriers. Warming drinks and lunch are cooked over an open fire. Returning to Brändön Lodge, your afternoon is at leisure before dining in the main lodge. With luck you may enjoy a panoramic aurora display whilst enjoying the lakeside sauna and bubble pool.

DAY 3 Husky Safari.

Enjoy a leisurely morning. Snowshoes are available should you wish to try a fun-filled walk before lunch.

This afternoon you will transfer to a local husky kennel. Here you will learn how to mush your own team of dogs and then, driving in pairs, you will embark on a thrilling ride through the forest and along the lakeside trail. Take it in turns to be both passenger and to mush. Return to Brändön Lodge for your final gourmet dinner.

DAY 4 Return to the UK.

Breakfast before your transfer to the airport in time for your return flight home.



BRÄNDÖN LODGE

The cottages at Brändön Lodge are simple yet warm and stylish. Each cabin has 2 bedrooms, a kitchenette, lounge, bathroom and veranda overlooking the frozen sea. The main pinewood lodge houses a cosy bar and restaurant, where Head Chef, Johan Hedenström designs imaginative menus based on locally-sourced produce. Johan is equally at home cooking in the kitchen as he is over an open fire in the Arctic wilderness. The facilities on hand are topped off by a lake-side sauna and bubble pool.

Today's adventure begins after breakfast where you will be coached in the ancient art of snowshoeing. Snowshoes have been a preferred form of transport in the region for thousands of years. It is an ideal way of traversing across deep snow and allows you to explore otherwise inaccessible terrain. Easy to master, you will soon be following your expert guide into the surrounding Brando forest. A rest stop and wilderness lunch is taken in a Sami tent, sitting on reindeer skins around an open fire. Return to the lodge where the remainder of the day is at leisure. Dinner is served in the lodge.

DAY 3 Snowmobile Safari.

Today's adventure is a 2 hour snowmobile safari through the snow covered forests. Adults drive in pairs with children drawn on a sled behind the guide. Stop half way for hot drinks where you can take in the tranquillity of the forest and admire some stunning views. Dinner is served in the lodge.

DAY 4 Husky & Northern Lights Adventure.

Visit a nearby husky kennel. Learn to mush a team of dogs, and then drive 2 per sled on an exciting ride through a forest. Lunch at the lodge. This evening enjoy a northern lights snowshoe walk with hot drinks served as you look out for the aurora.

DAY 5 Return to the UK.

Free time for some last minute snow fun before a return transfer to Luleå airport in time for your flight back to the UK.

The Finns consider a sauna to be a daily necessity, and it is a wonderful way to warm up and relax after a busy day having fun in the snow.

Finnish Lapland is steeped in the mysticism and legends of the indigenous Sami people, who have their own parliament at Inari. You will enjoy plenty of opportunities to meet them and learn about their culture and traditional skills. Finnish Lapland is also recognised as the home of Father Christmas


YOUR ACCOMMODATION

Located on the water's edge, the north facing pods have specially formulated curved glass ceilings, which allow you to watch nature unfold. SUGGESTED 6 DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1 Nellim.

Fly to Ivalo (via Helsinki) and transfer to Nellim Wilderness Lodge. Programme briefing, dinner and overnight for 5 nights.

DAY 2 Snowmobile Safari & Aurora Camp.

After breakfast receive full instructions on how to drive a snowmobile, before setting off, with your guide on a 50 km journey, which covers perfect fell scenery with forests and frozen lakes. Stop along the way for lunch around an open fire, returning to the hotel early afternoon. After dinner, depart for Nellim's Aurora Camp. Keep a look out for the northern lights from the heated lakeside cabin, whilst hot berry juice and snacks keep you warm, inside and out.

DAY 3 Meet Nellim's Alaskan huskies!

The kennels are just a short snowmobile sled transfer from the hotel. After instruction mush (in pairs), through the silent forest. Lunch is cooked en route over an open fire. The remainder of the day is at leisure before supper at the hotel.

DAY 4 Snowshoeing & Aurora Evening Snowmobile.

Today test your prowess for snowshoeing, followed by an evening's snowmobile excursion to a special spot by the lake to stake out the northern lights. Dine at the lodge.

DAY 5 A day with an Inari Reindeer Herder.


Board a snowmobile sled and head into the forest to meet a reindeer herder tending and feeding his herd in the wild. Continue along the shores of Lake Inari, with a stop for lunch in the company of local fishermen before continuing back to Nellim for supper and a final night of aurora spotting.

DAY 6 Return to the UK.

 Breakfast and transfer to Ivalo airport for your return flight back to London (via Helsinki).

DAY 1 Fly from the UK to Ivalo.

Fly to Ivalo (via Helsinki). Transfer to the Wilderness Nangu Hotel and enjoy dinner in the hotel restaurant.

DAY 2 Aurora Snowmobiling.

After breakfast, you will have some free time to try some cross country skiing or snowshoeing. Later you will head out by snowmobile to Lake Inari in search of the northern lights, looking for the best spots to view the open night sky. Driving distance depends on the weather conditions – if the sky looks promising, you will make more stops to admire the northern lights which will hopefully make their appearance.

DAY 3 Husky Safari and Reindeer Farm.

After breakfast, you will be transferred the 45km from Nangu to Nellim by car. Once you arrive, you will meet the excited huskies and be taught how to handle the sled before heading out for a ride, with the huskies pulling your sled through the beautiful winter scenery, and travelling across frozen Lake Inari. The dogs' excitement is infectious and as the animals fall silent on the trail, you will realise that this is the only way to see Lapland. After lunch at the Nellim Wilderness Lodge, you will visit the reindeer farm and get an insight into Sámi culture and the way of life in the north.

DAY 4 Return to the UK.

 Enjoy a morning at leisure before your transfer to Ivalo airport and flight back to the UK (via Helsinki).

Fly to Ivalo (via Helsinki). Transfer to the Wilderness Hotel Inari and enjoy dinner in the hotel restaurant.

DAY 2 Aurora Snowmobiling.

After breakfast, try your hand at cross country skiing - the traditional method of transportation in Finland. The guide will teach you how to use the skis, and once everyone's got the hang of it, you will be able to explore the surroundings of Lake Inari. After lunch there will be some time to relax before venturing off by snowmobile to search for the northern lights.

DAY 3 Husky Safari.

A husky safari is a 'must do' experience when visiting Lapland. You will be taught how to handle the sled before you head out for the husky safari, where the huskies will pull you through the beautiful winter scenery. Enjoy the excitement of the dogs before the start, and the serene silence once they get to do what they love – run in the snowy scenery. You will have lunch before or after the activity in the hotel. All our husky safaris are based on two people sharing a sled unless otherwise stated.

DAY 4 Snowshoeing and Skiing.

Stop for lunch by an open fire, Sami style, before returning to the lodge. This evening you will drive snowmobiles to a nearby northern lights hotspot and a final chance to catch the aurora.

DAY 5 **Return to the UK.**

Breakfast and the morning is at leisure before your return transfer to Ivalo airport and your flight to the UK (via Helsinki).



This is not a luxury resort, however, the accommodation is rustic, warm and cosy. There is a wide range of accommodation to suit all party and family sizes, spread over a large area.

Choose from Log Chalets, sleeping up to 10 with a sauna and log fire. Glass igloos (larger ones have a shower cabin, smaller ones a basin and WC). Snow igloos with ice beds and Kelo Glass Igloos. These cosy hideaways combine the comforting warmth of a log cabin with the stunning views of the glass igloos and sleep up to 6 with a private sauna, fireplace and kitchenette. Early evening, you will gather to receive a snowmobile induction, before heading out (driving in pairs), to a spot on the fells, known locally as being an aurora hotspot. Return to Kakslauttanen for dinner.

DAY 4 Husky Safari and a Night under the Stars.

After breakfast today, you will enjoy a thrilling 4-hour husky safari. Travelling two to a sled, you each take it in turns to mush a sixteam pack of huskies across the enchanting wilderness of the Urho Kekkonen Park. Lunch is al-fresco, around an open fire.

On your return to Kakslauttanen, gather your belongings and head to your 'igloo'. Heated to 21°c and constructed with thermal glass, the star-studded night sky is always on display, should the dancing lights appear, the aurora borealis too.

DAY 5 Return to the UK.

Enjoy a sauna and breakfast before your shuttle transfer back to the airport in time for your return flight to the UK.

HARRINIVA WILDERNESS LODGE

Harriniva Wilderness Lodge stands alongside the frozen Muonio River, marking the border between Finnish and Swedish Lapland. Here, the Pietikäinen family have offered hospitality for over 25 years to travellers, fishermen and skiers. Comfortable and versatile accommodation includes 46 pine-clad rooms, all with private WC/shower. In addition, there are 6 larger rooms with private saunas and 12 duplex, apartment-style rooms, ideal for larger families. After this thrilling adventure, visit Siida, the Sami Museum, a fascinating interactive exhibition of Sami history and culture. Lunch at the museum (own expense). FINLAND LUOSTO

Luosto nestles amongst the rolling hills of the Phyä-Luosto National Park, just 90 minutes from Rovaniemi Airport. Take a fairytale trip to the nearby Lampivaara amethyst mines, set on the top of Lampivaara hill, where you will have the opportunity to dig for your own lucky amethyst. Perhaps the most comfortable way to reach the amethyst mine is to take the pendolino 'snow train', a warm carriage pulled by snow-cat up to the top of the mountain (Price from £70 per person)

Luosto is also a northern lights hotspot, and has put in place an innovative system for visitors to alert them when the aurora is visible. Sign up for the online 'Aurora Alert Realtime' service, which is a free service, and make sure that you don't miss out on seeing the northern lights.

HOTEL GRIMSBORGIR

SUGGESTED 5 DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1 Grímsnes.

Arrive at Keflavik airport, collect your hire car and drive to Hotel Grimsborgir, lying in the shadow of Mount Hengil and your home for the following 3 nights. Dine at the hotel restaurant before retiring to look out for the northern lights on your deck or in a hot tub.

DAY 2 South Coast.

After a hearty breakfast, we suggest driving along the south coast to Dyrholaey and on to the promontory from where you will have views of the Reynisfjall cliffs and black sand beaches. Return via Skógafoss and Seljalandsfoss, two of Iceland's most picturesque waterfalls, one of which you can walk under. Continue to Eyrarbakki with its weatherboard houses and perhaps a lobster supper at Vid Fjorubordid before returning to Hotel Grimsborgir.

DAY 3 Golden Circle.

Take a short walk around the 3,000 year old Kerid crater before heading to the Geysir area. Here Strokkur spouts impressively every 5-10 minutes and there are steaming fumaroles and hot springs bubbling alongside. On to Gullfoss where the glacial river Hvita powers down a staircase of falls eventually plummeting down a 32m drop. Fill your afternoon with some glacier snowmobiling on Langjokull or visit Thingvellir National Park, Iceland's ultimate historical, cultural and geological site.

DAY 4 Reykjavik.



Sit back on this exciting guided tour and spend days discovering lceland's legendary natural wonders and nights under a canopy of stars in search of the aurora borealis. Take in the geyser that gave the world the name; Gullfoss, the golden waterfall; Jökulsárlón, the iceberg lagoon and Eyjafjallajökull, which erupted with such spectacular consequences in 2010.

SUGGESTED 5 DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1 UK to Reykjavik.

Fly direct to Keflavik from a choice of regional airports. Transfer on arrival and check in to the CenterHotel Plaza. Acquaint yourself with the historic city centre and enjoy an early dinner in one of the many local restaurants. Don't forget to sign up for the northern lights wake-up alert before retiring.

DAY 2 Golden Circle.

After breakfast you will meet your qualified, local guide and like-minded travellers, before heading to see the trio of sites known as the Golden Circle. Thingvellir National Park was the location for Iceland's first parliament and is where you can see the dramatic rift valley which caused the movement of the American and Eurasian tectonic plates. Stop at the geysir area where, amongst the bubbling fumaroles and hot springs, Strokkur spouts impressively every 5-10 minutes. Onwards to Gullfoss, the waterfall that plummets 32m before twisting and tumbling on down a steep canyon.

Along the way you will stop at a stud farm breeding the easygoing 5-gaited Icelandic horse. Alongside is a tomato farm which utilises the ample supply of geothermal water to produce tomatoes year-round. Pausing at Eyjafjallajökull Visitor Centre, you can view a short film showing the fortitude of the local farmers following the 2010 eruption, before arriving at your countryside accommodation, the Hotel Katla, your base for the next 2 nights. After dinner (pay locally) you will head out into the local surroundings in search of the northern lights.

DAY 3 Glacier Lagoon.

After breakfast you will drive further along the south-east coast across bridges fording dramatic outwash plains, interspersed with black sand beaches and lava fields, to Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon. The luminous blue icebergs float in the lagoon for several years, gradually sculpting themselves into varying shapes before finally working their way out to sea. Return to Vik via Skaftafell National Park on the southern edge of the mighty Vatnajökull Glacier. Dinner and another chance for an aurora search at Hotel Katla, if not seen on the previous evening.

DAY 4 Volcanos and Waterfalls.

Today you will return along the south coast, stopping at two of Iceland's plunge waterfalls. Seljalandsfoss, which spills straight off the cliffs of the former coastline and Skógafoss, which often welcomes you with a rainbow. The last call of the day is the Blue Lagoon and a chance to bathe in the soothing milky blue waters before bidding farewell to your travel companions. Overnight at the CenterHotel Plaza.

DAY 5 Return to the UK

Explore Reykjavik before your transfer to Keflavik and flight home.

It offers luxury accommodation within easy reach of nearby sights of natural interest such as Thingvellir National Park and the erupting geysers that Iceland is so famous for.

THE RETREAT HOTEL

The Retreat Hotel opened in 2018 and is built into an 800-year-old lava flow on the south shore of the Blue Lagoon, tapping into the same volcanic aquifer of geothermal saltwater. Each of the suites has minimalist design with floor-to-ceiling windows and the Retreat Spa offers a unique treatment called the Blue Lagoon Ritual where you experience the revitalisation of the geothermal seawater. The Moss Restaurant is billed as a foodie destination, highlighting the country's culinary heritage.





SUGGESTED 6 DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1 Fly to Iceland.

Fly to Keflavik Airport, where you will be met by your private driver and travel for an hour through Iceland's unique landscape and then check in to the ION Adventure Hotel. 

Today's highlights are a walk through the lava formations of Dimmuborgir (if snowy, a snowshoe walk) said to be inhabited by trolls. Return to the hotel for a light lunch. Afternoon at leisure. After dinner enjoy a relaxing soak at Lake Mývatn Nature Baths and a northern lights hunt.

DAY 5 Exploring Lake Myvatn.

Take an easy guided walk around Lake Mývatn, renowned for its lava formations and bird life. Visit the hot spring area of Námaskarð with its bubbling mud pools and steaming solfataras for a chance to taste traditional dark bread baked underground in the geothermal heat. After dinner, enjoy a video about the northern lights.

DAY 6 Akurevri.

Visit the bird museum and travel to Goðafoss, the waterfall of the Gods. Next stop is the Christmas Garden, a museum and shop focused on Icelandic Christmas traditions. The afternoon is free to explore Akureyri, the capital of North Iceland. Dine at leisure and depending on the conditions, there is a short excursion to hunt the aurora borealis.

DAY 7 Return to Reykjavik.

Return to Reykjavik via a western route over the mountains to Skagafjörður. Visit the folk museum and turf farm at Glaumbær. Enjoy a guided tour of the only tannery in Europe making fish leather. Stop for coffee and cake and learn about the Icelandic horse. Check in to the Keahotel Skuggi for your last night. Evening at leisure in Reykjavik.

DAY 8 Return to the UK.

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before taking the shuttle bus back to the airport in time for your flight home. We can arrange for you to visit the Blue Lagoon for a final Icelandic experience (supplement applies). NB: You will spend an average of 3 hours on the bus each day.
