



It may be one of Europe's smallest capitals, but it certainly puts many others to shame with its wealth of attractions. In close proximity are geysers, caves, hot springs and glaciers. The city centre, with its many galleries, museums and monuments, reflects the cultural and creative diversity of Iceland's small population (321,000). Buildings owe more to nature than to architects. The Hallsgrimskirkja Church, which overlooks the whole town resembles as a gigantic piece of molten lava. The plethora of restaurants pride themselves on crafting culinary delights from an abundance of locally sourced products.

Our brief encounter to Reykjavik is designed to be flexible. Choose your hotel and combine with any one of our excursions and adventures detailed on pages 6-7 to create your ideal stay. ### YOUR TOUR

**Day 1 UK – Reykjavik** Scheduled flight from UK to Keflavik Airport. Transfer to and check in at your chosen hotel (see opposite page for our favourites).

Day 2 & 3 Reykjavik & beyond. Take your pick from our extensive range of safari excursions (p6-7) and make the most of your stay. There is plenty for both first time and returning visitors. Must do's are the Golden Circle which comes in coats of many colours; the south coast's waterfalls, black sand beaches and Jokulsarlon lagoon. Take a thrilling ride in a Super Jeep or helicopter. Climb on top of a glacier or delve into lava caves. See puffins and whales or ride an Icelandic horse. Half day, full day and evening excursions are also detailed on our website.

**Day 4 Reykjavik – UK** Depending on your return flight you may have time for last minute sightseeing or shopping. Alternatively stop off at the Blue Lagoon on the way to the airport for your return flight home.

#### THE CENTRUM HOTEL


### **HOTEL BORG**

# Excursions: Reykjavik & Beyond

The world's most northerly capital offers a treasure trove of culture and history, a wealth of wildlife, culinary delights and dazzling natural wonders. Take a thrill seeking Super Jeep ride, view the geysers and glaciers and volcanic activity up close and personal from above or below. Watch for whales, seek out the puffins or ride an Icelandic horse. These are some of our recommendations for excursions with any visit to Reykjavik:

### **GOLDEN CIRCLE CLASSIC**

An all-day scenic extravaganza. First stop are the landscapes south of Lake Pingvallavath before the National Park Pingvellir. From there continue to Gullfoss, the Golden Waterfall, with its foaming, thundering waters forming a mist of glacial waters that you can feel. Continue to the Geyser area with its spouting water geysers and bubbling mud pots with time for lunch (payable locally). Return to Reykjavík via the cathedral at Skalholt, the extraordinary crater Kerid and the greenhouse community Hveragerdi. Daily. Hotel pickup 08.00. Duration 8½ hrs. Price from £55 pp

#### **REYKJAVIK SIGHTSEEING**

Get your bearings in and around Reykjavik. This tour includes the most significant places in the capital and the surrounding towns including the presidential residence, the thriving harbour town of Hafnarfjordur, a scenic treasure and home to the 'hidden folk'. Enjoy a birds-eye view of Reykjavik from Perlan and the Hallgrimskirkja church. The Old harbour & town and the geothermal heated outdoor swimming pools in Langardalur. Daily. Hotel pick-up: 08.30. Duration: 2½ hrs. Price from: £35 pp

#### **REYKJAVIK BY FOOD**

Learn about Icelandic food traditions and take this guided tour around Reykjavik's streets & restaurants tasting some of the delicious and sometimes unusual culinary customs. As you stroll the streets you will stop at selected restaurants and café's where your host will introduce you to authentic tastes of Iceland including local beers, cheeses, meats and fish. #### **GOLDEN CIRCLE EVENING**

You will see all the 'musts' under an evening sky giving a different perspective on some of Iceland's most iconic images. You will visit Pingvellir National Park to witness the power of what two tectonic plates do to the landscape. It was also the original meeting spot of the Icelandic Parliament. Continue to the magnificent Gullfoss waterfall with the last stop being the amazing spouting Geysers before returning to Reykjavik. Daily 1 Jun – 20 Aug. Hotel pick-up 18.30. Duration 5 hrs. Price from £55 pp.

### WHALE WATCHING

Whale watching boat, Rósin (The Rose), offers a fast and luxurious whale watching experience, which takes you to the spotting area in the quickest possible time. There is a comfortable heated seating area with large windows, ample decks and onboard café. During puffin season (1 May – 20 Aug) you sail past the islands of Akurey and Lundey, inhabited by thousands of puffins. Daily. Up to 5 departures during high season. Hotel pick-up. Duration:  $2-2\frac{1}{2}$  hrs. Price from: £45 pp.

### **SEA ANGLING**

These sea angling tours are perfectly suited to both experienced fishermen and those who simply wish to relax and enjoy the beautiful surroundings. You will head out to Faxafloi Bay. During season you will also pass the puffin islands on your way to the fishing grounds. Experienced staff usually spot fish in a flash. The Captain & crew are always on hand for advice and some entertaining stories. Keep your catch or BBQ on-board. Daily departures – 01 May to 31 Aug at 17.00. Hotel pick-up. Duration:  $2\frac{1}{2} - 3$  hrs. Price from: £55 pp.





### THE LAVA TRAIL ON HORSEBACK

This guided horse trek takes you along lava fields and hillside tracks previously used by their Viking ancestors. Particularly suitable for novices or those with rusty equestrian skills, the Icelandic horse is famed for its even temper and unique gait which gives a particularly smooth ride. You will transfer to the riding centre where on arrival you will be supplied with; riding hat, boots, waterproof outwear and tack. Home-made lunch at the riding centre included. Daily. Hotel pick up 08.30/12.45. Duration: 3 hrs. (1½-2 hrs riding). Price from: £75 pp.

### SUPER JEEP CLASSIC

Something of an Icelandic phenomenon, the Super Jeep makes any excursion more thrilling. For part of this trip you will travel across wild barren landscapes and plunge through icy streams on your journey around the Golden Circle. This includes the National Park Pingvellir, the Geyser area and the golden waterfall of Gullfoss before continuing on to Langjokull for an optional snowmobile tour on top of the glacier (additional cost). You will return via the cathedral at Skalholt, the crater Kerid and the greenhouse community Hveragerdi. Year round: Tues, Thu & Sat. Hotel pick-up: 08.30 Duration: 8-9 hrs. Price from: £199 pp.



### SUPER JEEP VOLCANO HAT TRICK

The skilled drivers and guides of the Super Jeep take you off road and along rough mountain tracks to the foot of Mount Hekla – the most active volcano in Iceland, the Kerid crater as well as the Stora Eldborg volcano in this scenic hat trick. This full day tour invites you to experience some of the best views and nature that Iceland has to offer. Year round. Min. 4 people. Hotel pick-up: 09.00. Duration: 9-10 hrs. Price from: £245 pp.

### SOUTH COAST & JOKULSARLON GLACIAL LAGOON

This coach tour takes you along Iceland's beautiful south shore through charming villages and passing Iceland's biggest volcano to Jokulsarlon Glacial Lagoon. The Glacial Lagoon temporarily traps huge blocks of ice that have calved from Europe's largest glacier before they drift out into the open ocean. You will board an amphibious vehicle capable of travelling on land and water for a unique view of these natural sculptures – before returning to Reykjavik. Available Apr – Oct. Hotel pick-up: 07.30. Duration: 14 hrs. Prices from: £199 pp. \*Available from early May dependent on ice conditions

### **GEOTHERMAL HELICOPTER TOUR**

A helicopter tour gives you a view of Iceland's volcanic landscape like no other. Its subterranean energy is on full view as you fly over geothermal hot springs, colourful mountain ranges, power plants, lava fields and craters. You land far away from the crowds and make a brief stop to witness the raw, primeval forces rising up from the earth beneath. On the return journey you will fly over Reykjavik for an aerial view of the city. Available year round (min 3 passengers Sep-Apr). Meeting point: Reykjavik Domestic Airport Duration: 40-75 mins. Prices from: £230 pp



### WESTMAN ISLANDS DAY TRIP

Fly from Reykjavik Domestic Airport by plane to the volcanic island of Heimaey in the Westman Islands archipelago where you will be taken on an escorted coach tour to witness a volcanic crater, still warm lava and half buried houses resulting from the island's infamous 1973 volcanic eruption. After the tour you have free time to explore at your leisure or take an optional boat tour (additional cost/summer only). Available year round. Meeting point: Reykjavik Domestic Airport at 07.15 w/days or 10.30 wkds Duration: 10 hrs. Prices from: £295 pp.


### TAKE A WALK ON THE WILDSIDE

A glacier walk is a great way to experience Icelandic nature. Just east of the famous Eyjafjallajokull volcano and 2 hours from Reykjavik lies Solheimajokull. After a safety demonstration you will be led by experienced guides on a safe and easy glacier walk on crampons up onto the ice field. You will explore ridges and deep crevasses and learn more about these disappearing giants. On the way back there is a stop at the picturesque waterfalls, Skógafoss and Seljalandsfoss. Available daily. Hotel pick-up: from 08.30. Duration: 9-10 hrs. (3½ hrs on the ice) Bring your own lunch. Hiking boots can be rented. Prices from: £120 pp.



### **ICELAND FROM BELOW**

A more demanding excursion that will give you a unique view of Iceland's most spectacular lava tube caves and craters. You will enter through narrow cave entrances which reveal extraordinary scenes of colour, stalactites and lava formations. Wide and high in some places, narrow and low in others you will need to be able to walk on uneven surfaces and at times crawl through narrow gaps. Experienced guides, overalls, light mittens & helmet provided. Good walking shoes recommended. Year round: Sat & Sun. Hotel pick-up: 12.30. Duration: 3 hrs. Price from: £60 pp.





# The Scenic South with Reykjavik

Immediately immerse yourself in Southern Iceland's unique cocktail of sights, by choosing to stay in one of our idyllic country retreats. Days can be spent exploring the region before returning each night to the comfort of our recommended hotels, each of which, offer fine dining, hot tubs, spa's, exceptional service and strikingly scenic locations. Complete this Icelandic short break by then swopping the countryside for the charm of Reykjavik and an injection of city chic.

# THINGS TO SEE AND DO

The hotels that we have chosen (p13) are located in the heart of Southern lceland allowing you complete flexibility in choosing what style of hotel suits you and where and when you wish to spend your days. Highlights of the region include:

### THE GOLDEN CIRCLE

A 'must do' for every visitor to Iceland. See Gullfoss waterfall with its unique 90° turn, the Geysir area, after which this natural phenomen is named, and where Strokkur still spouts impressively. Last but not least Thingvellir, where the early Vikings set up the world's first parliamentary assembly on the junction of the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates.

### SKOGARFOSS AND SELJALANDSFOSS

Seljalandsfoss spills straight off the Fell side dropping into a shallow pool behind which you can stand. Skógarfoss similarly drops straight down into the pool below. Stand on the gravel river bed watching your surrounding world disappear in white mist.

### THORSMORK

Travelling inland is Thorsmork. Largely covered by the ash from the Eyjafallajokull eruption in 2010 nature rapidly reclaimed the area and returned it as a summer haven. It is once again one of Iceland's most popular hiking areas with numerous marked trails and magnificent views whatever the weather.

### **WESTMAN ISLANDS**

Dubbed 'Pompei of the North' following the volcanic eruption in 1973, Vestmannaeyjar on the island of Heimaey in the Westman Islands was largely destroyed. View the ongoing project to recover some of the 400 buildings that were covered by the lava and ash. Take a walk and enjoy the still warm earth that surrounds Eldafell or a boat tour of the uninhabited islands. Travel as a foot passenger or take your car on the ferry which operates up to 5 departures a day in the summer and takes just 30 minutes from Landeyjahofn.

### **DYRHOLAEY & VIK**

Visit the birdcliffs at Dyrholaey and the black sand beaches near Vik. Reynisfjara, with its basalt caves, is particularly memorable.

**Day 1 UK – Keflavik** Scheduled flight to Keflavik. Collect your hire car at the airport and drive to your chosen hotel for 3 nights.

Days 2 & 3 At leisure to explore your surroundings.

Day 4 Reykjavik Drive to Reykjavík for a final night at the Hotel Centrum.

**Day 5 Reykjavík – UK** Enjoy Reykjavik or depart for a morning bathe in the Blue Lagoon before continuing to Keflavik for your return flight to the UK.

#### **HOTEL ION**



# Highlights of Iceland

Price £1195pp

May – September

Iceland's southwest corner has some of its most dramatic natural attractions. At Vík, on the island's southern tip is Dyrholaey's bird cliff promontory, from whence black sand beaches fringed with ocean foam stretch as far as the eye can see. Also visit Gullfoss, Geysir and the Pingvellir valley with its faults and fissures at the junction of the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates.

# YOUR TOUR

**Day 1 UK – Keflavík** Scheduled flight to Reykjavík. Transfer on arrival to the nearby Northern Light Inn for an overnight stop with time for a bathe in the Blue Lagoon before dinner.

**Day 2 Keflavík – Vík** After breakfast, transfer back (15 minutes) to Keflavik to collect your hire car and set off along the South coast towards Vik. Recommended stops along the route include Seljalandsfoss behind which you can walk or the naturally heated pool at Seljavellir for a quick dip and Dyrholaey bird cliffs. Overnight at Dyrholaey Hotel for 2 nights.

**Day 3 Skaftafell and Jokulsarlon** Drive along the southeast coast across bridges fording dramatic outwash plains interspersed with black sand beaches and lava fields. Together with a walk in Skaftafell Park or snowmobile ride on Solheimajokul, the highlight of the day is undoubtedly Jokulsarlon Glacial Lagoon.

Day 4 Vík – Hekla Drive up to the Geysir area, where Strokkur spouts impressively every 5 to 10 minutes. Alongside there are steaming fumaroles, hot springs and pools, some of which are a dark muddy grey whilst others are a translucent turquoise. Continue onwards to Gullfoss, the golden waterfall, where the glacial river Hvita plummets 32 metres before twisting and tumbling down a large gorge. Overnight at Hotel Hekla.

**Day 5 Hekla – Reykjavík** After breakfast visit Skalholt Cathedral and the Pingvellir Valley and continue to Reykjavik. Return hire car and overnight at Hotel Plaza or similar.

**Day 6 Reyjavík – UK** Time for some last minute shopping before transfer back to Keflavik and return flight to UK.

### YOUR TOUR

**Day 1 UK – Keflavik** Scheduled flight to Keflavik. Transfer on arrival to and overnight at Hotel Centrum for three night stay.

**Day 2 Whale Watching** Enjoy an educational and interactive trip aboard the Roisin learning about and searching for whales. The Roisin is equipped to take you to the whale spotting area located just 20-30 minutes from the Old harbour in Reykjavik. Spend the remainder of the day at your leisure.

**Day 3 Golden Circle Excursion** Explore the landscapes south of Lake Pingvallavatn before reaching Pingvellir. Visit Gullfoss with its foaming, thundering waters invariably over-arched with a rainbow before continuing to the Geysir area with its spouting geysers and bubbling mud pots with time for lunch (payable locally). Return to Reykjavík via the cathedral at Skalholt, the extraordinary crater Kerid and the greenhouse village of Hveragerdi.

**Day 4 Rekjavík – Akureyri** Self transfer to the domestic airport for an early morning flight to Akureyri. You will be met at the airport and a shuttle transfer will take you to the village of Reykhalid with a stop at Godafoss Waterfall. Afternoon at leisure. provides a gentle bulwark against the swell.

Minke whale is the most common species but recently the Humpback Whale is also frequently sighted. Skjálfandi Bay is also the natural habitat to Puffins and Arctic Terns. You also have the option to visit the Whale Museum, displaying full-size whale skeletons, a Folk Museum and other interesting sites.

**Day 7 Akureyri – Reykjavík** Free time to explore the Myvatn area further. Late afternoon departure by bus to Akureyri airport for early evening scheduled flight to Reykjavík. Self transfer to and overnight at Hotel Centrum.

# YOUR TOUR

**Day 1 UK – Reykjavik** Fly from a choice of regional airports to Keflavik. Collect your hire car on arrival, drive to and overnight at Hotel Fludir for 2 nights.

**Day 2 Fludir** Spend a day savouring south Iceland's attractions: the Geysir geothermal area with its hot springs, fumaroles stained yellow with sulphur and Thykkuhverir, the viscous hot springs. Visit Gulfoss, whose waters flow down a 3 step staircase before plunging in two stages down a crevice at right angles to the flow of the river, and Pingvellir, home to Althing the oldest parliament in the world and an important part of Icelandic culture.

**Day 3 Fludir – Vik** Drive down to and along the south coast stopping at Seljandsfoss and Skogafoss, possibly detouring up to Myrdalsjokull for a glacier snowmobile ride before arriving at Dyrholaey. Overnight at Hotel Dyrholaey.

Day 4 Vik – Skaftafell Drive along the southeast coast with its vast outwash plains forded by bridges and Skeidarasandur, as well as the black sands of the Skeidarsandur glacier before arriving at the edge of Skaftafell National Park. Overnight at Fosshotel Nupar.

**Day 5 Skaftafell – Seydisfjordur** The highlight of this day's journey is the Jokulsarlon Glacier Lagoon, undoubtedly one of Iceland's 'wow factor' sights. Continue driving along the still gravelled section of route 1 overhung by rhyolite crags contouring the indented coastline dotted with fishing villages before descending to Seydisfjördur. Overnight at Hotel Aldan.

**Day 6 Seydisfjördur – Myvatn** Vast, seemingly endless deserts of glacially crushed rock are the hallmark of the day before arriving at the contrastingly lush Lake Myvatn area. Overnight at Hotel Reykjahlid or Reyhnilid for 2 nights.



**Day 7 Myvatn** Time to explore the extraordinary scenery and wildlife of the area. Notable sights include the wooded headland at Hofdi with its lava pillars, the contorted black towers of Dimmuborgir, the pastel coloured Námafjall ridge with its steamy surroundings and the smouldering, sulphurous Krafla caldera. If you travel further afield you can discover there are the multi-hued houses that hug the mountainside by the fishing village of Husavik, from where you can go whale spotting, the unusually wooded canyon at Asbyrgi, Dettifoss the largest waterfall in Europe and the somewhat forgotten Godafoss with its wide curtain fall.

**Day 8 Myvatn – Saudarkrokur** Drive to Akureyri, through the Oxnadalsheidi pass and then round to Laugarbakki for a night at Gauksmyri Lodge in the heart of horse breeding country.

**Day 9 Laugarbakki – Isafjordur** Take the road across to Blonduos and follow the fjord road through some of the country's most verdant countryside, then continue via Steingrímsfjardarheidi to Isafjördur for 2 nights at Hotel Edda.

**Day 10 Isafjordur** Time to explore one of Iceland's most remote towns. Once home to a prosperous fishing industry, the decline has thrown up some guirky alternatives including swamp mud football!

**Day 11 Isafjordur – Grundarfjordur** Drive south to Dynjandi or Fjallfoss (a series of 7 waterfalls with a combined height of 100m) and then along the northern side of the Snæfellsness peninsula, dropping in on Stykkisholmur and finally to Grundarfjordur for 2 nights at Hotel Framnes.

**Day 12 Grundarfjordur** A 'take your pick' day. Birdwatch on Breidafjordur bay, take the car round to the vertiginous bird cliffs at Arnarstapi (the hike between there and Hellnar is beautiful) or climb up on to Snæfellsjokull glacier. The choice is yours.



# A Walk on the Wild Side

Enjoy a week hiking in the rugged scree scarred countryside of Iceland's eastern coast where the mountains meet the Atlantic in a tapestry of secluded coves, moss clad valleys, pastel coloured rhyolite mountains, narrow fjords and black sand beaches. This trail is suitable for anyone able to go for a brisk 3-4 hour walk.

# YOUR TOUR

**Day 1 Reykjavik** Scheduled flight to Keflavik Airport and transfer for overnight at the Plaza Hotel, located in the city centre.

Day 2 Borgafordur (16km) Self transfer to Reykjavik's domestic airport for an hour's flight to Egilsstadir. You'll be met and transferred to the 'Elf House' in Borgarfjordur, just an hour's drive from the airport and your base for the next 6 nights. This family owned B&B has 30 comfortable en-suite rooms and a restaurant serving delicious home-cooked, locally sourced food. The afternoon passes with an easy 16km hike beginning with a visit to the puffins at Borgafordur then walking through the Brunavik pass strolling along black sand beaches before returning via the Hofstrandarskard pass and colourful Helgargil canyon. Dinner is served each evening at the B&B.

**Day 3 Stapavík to Njardvík (11km)** Today you will hike along Selfljót river to the seashore. From Stapavík it is an easy hike along Gönguskörd pass, which was the main route between Borgarfjördur and Fljótsdalshérad valley for 1000 years.

**Day 4 Breidavík (15km)** Start with an easy hike over moors and gravelly ground before reaching Breidavík. The Rhyolite Mountains along the way display an incredible range of pastel colours. After a short stop you will hike up to Gagnheidi ridge for fabulous views over the area.

**Day 5 Borgarfjordur Valley (12km)** Begin the day exploring Breidavik's old turf house, concert hall and local fish factory. You will hike on unmarked sheep trails in the valley of Borgarfjördur, up to 'the Dark Valley' and 'Glacier Valley' under the Door Mountains. Walk through the elf community of Lobbuhraun and their home in Dimmidalur valley.

**Day 6 Storurd (16km)** Today is the most challenging walk due to the gravelly terrain and scree. The day's hike starts by going up and crossing Geldingafjall. Excellent views perhaps even as far as Vatnajokull glacier and Mt. Snæfell. Decend to Stórurd, where calm turquoise-coloured basins of icy water lie hidden among the huge boulders then either opt for the hike along to Dyrfjöll or down the valley below Rjúpnafell peak.

**Day 7 Mývatn (5 hrs drive & 4 hr hike)** A drive towards Mývatn area with sightseeing along the way including the powerfull Dettifoss waterfall and a hike in the smoking lava of Leirhnjúkur. Continue onwards to the Hverir area with bubbling mud and smoking steam then on to Myvatn Lake and the geothermal nature bath. You will return to Egilsstadir for your evening flight back to Reykjavik and final night at the Plaza hotel.

**Day 8 Reykjavik – UK** Time for last minute sightseeing or a relaxing soak in the Blue Lagoon before your return flight to the UK.

# Horse Trailing and Trekking

Follow in the footsteps of Icelandic Vikings and travel on horseback, opening up the opportunity to travel through terrain not normally accessed by walking or driving. The horses are renowned for their patience and sweet nature and are therefore an excellent choice for novices and experienced equestrians alike. The following itinerary is just one of a choice of small group tours for those with a basic knowledge of horsemanship. Other tours will appeal to more proficient riders.

### YOUR TOUR

**Day 1 UK to Keflavik** Scheduled flight from a number of UK airports to Keflavik, where you will take the airport shuttle to the Plaza Hotel in Reykjavik, in the heart of town.

**Day 2 Harnarfjord** Following a hearty breakfast you will be driven to the Ishestar Horse Riding Centre, just 9km from the centre of Reykjavik. The Centre will provide you with warm jackets, rainwear, boots and helmets after which you will meet your first horse and will be given instruction on the five different "gaits" (speeds) the horse has mastered. Your 20 km tour starts with a leisurely ride along the Thjorsa River so that you and your horse can get to know each other. Accommodation for two nights is at Fosses Farm, in an area of gentle hills with a dramatic mountain backdrop. Lunch and dinner are included.

**Day 3 Hvitardalur** Prepare your packed lunch from the plentiful breakfast buffet. Today's tour of 30 km is a trail across lush agricultural country with a picnic lunch at the corral where sheep are rounded up each autumn. The horses stay behind at the farm and you drive back to Fossnes with time to relax in the outdoor hot tub before a hearty dinner.

**Day 4 Gullfoss** Your 25 km trek will take you through a deep canyon and soaring mountains to the Gullfoss waterfall and to the Geyser hot spring area. Two nights at Kjoastadir Farm in twin rooms with en-suite facilities.

**Day 5 Geysir** The 20 km trail takes you through birch forests up into the richness of the wild mountain flowers, with views to match. You do have the option to take a snowmobile drive on Langjokull Glacier (supplement applies).

**Day 6 Reykjavik** After breakfast a transfer will take you back to Reykjavik, where you will check into the Reykjavik Hotel and have the remainder of the day and evening at your leisure or for further optional excursions. We would be happy to suggest tours for you to contrast with the previous 4 days riding.

**Day 7 UK** Breakfast at leisure and enjoy some time before your return airport shuttle takes you to Keflavik for your return flight home. Do ask if you wish to stop off at the Blue Lagoon on the way (supplement applies).

**Day 4 Vatnajokull National Park or At Leisure** Today is free or you can join an optional day tour to the southern part of the Vatnajokull National Park, home of Europe's largest glacier and the captivating Jokulsarlon glacier lagoon.

**Day 5 Westman Islands** Take a short ferry ride to the Westman Islands, where the 1973 eruption almost destroyed the island and town of Heimaey. There is a coach and walking tour, which will allow you to explore bird cliffs,

walk up the volcano crater and visit "Pompeii of the North", a volcanic excavation project.

**Day 6 Golden Circle** Today visit three of Iceland's most iconic images: Gullfoss waterfall, Geyser hot springs and Thingvellir National Park.

**Day 7 Reykjanes Peninsula** Your return to Reykjavik is via Reykjanes Peninsula with its diverse geological features including the hot springs of Krysuvík, mountains, lava fields, and moon landscapes. You will also see amazing bird cliffs and travel through colourful fishing villages before concluding the tour back in Reykjavik with a late afternoon city tour. Overnight at the Hotel Plaza.


The Icebergs of Sermermiut Take a leisurely walk along the UNESCO designated Ilulissat Icefjord to Sermermiut, where traces of old Eskimo cultures can be seen. Admire the carpet of wildflowers, berries and heather that surround the boardwalk whilst the ever present icebergs provide the backdrop. 3 hrs. Refreshments included. £43 pp

**Midnight Cruise to the Ice Fjord** Enjoy the captivating sight of the midnight sun reflecting on the giant icebergs as you cruise between these towering frozen monoliths. Enjoy a Martini on the 'real rocks'. Outside the midnight sun season (22 May – 24 Jul) this excursion operates as an evening cruise, where the beautiful sunset reflecting across the icebergs is no less spectacular. 3 hrs. **£86 pp** 

**Eqip – The Calving Glacier** A cruise deep into the fjord to the imposing Eqip Glacier. As Icebergs lazily pass by you may even spot some whales. Once you arrive at the 5km wide glacier face you will hear the thunderclaps of the constantly moving glacier and even witness chunks of ice tumbling down into the turquoise waters below. The tour concludes with a visit to a former trading station, where you will enjoy a delicious 2-course lunch. 8 hrs. £245 pp

**Rodebay Hunter's Settlement** Journey by boat to the small settlement of Rodebay (pop. 40). Take a guided walk through the village before lunch at the old trading station. 6 hrs. £160 pp

Heli Sightseeing Fly over mountains, lakes and running streams as well as the lcefjord for a bird's eye view of the stranded icebergs. 20 mins flying time. £175 pp



# Greenland from the Sea

This is a slice of authentic Greenland, up close and personal, showcasing the variety that this vast land has to offer.

# YOUR TOUR

**Day 1 UK – Reykjavik** Scheduled flight to Reykjavik, transfer and overnight at Hotel Reykjavik Natura.

Day 2 Reykjavik – Ilulissat Fly into Ilulissat, the 'Town of Icebergs' where you will transfer to Hotel Arctic, your base for the next 3 nights. Following check-in you will take a guided city walk followed by a welcome dinner and briefing on your programme for the week.

**Day 3-4 Ilulissat** These days are free for optional excursions. See p21 or our website for full details of what you can experience in this exceptional location.

**Day 5 MV Sarfaq Ittuk** Late afternoon board the MV Sarfaq Ittuk. Life on board is relaxed. Whilst sailing towards the archipelago you can sit on deck, in the viewing lounge or at Cafe Sarfaq, whilst keeping an eye out for sightings of bowhead and humpback whales. The boat stops at Aasiaat (pop. 3000), whose old town is home to a local museum as well as a community hall decorated with paintings by world-renowned Danish painter, Per Kirkeby.

Day 6 At Sea Sisimiut & ManiitsoqThe journey continues southwards in open water and through narrow straits. You will find it hard to drag yourself away from the unfolding landscape. Your onboard guide will give lectures about different aspects of Greenland, and also conduct walking tours of today's ports of call, which are Sisimiut, known for its colourful wooden houses, whilst further south is Maniitsoq, where Alpine peaks rise 2km straight out of the sea and which are home to abundant birdlife. **Day 7 At Sea** An early arrival in Nuuk, the capital city. You can choose to take a guided bus tour of the town or wander at your leisure. The National Museum of Greenland, home to the Qilakitsoq Mummies, which date back to 1460. Whilst in port, the old harbour area is also worth a visit before sailing onwards to Qeqertarsuatsiaat and its population of 240 people.

**Day 8 At Sea** Today the ship reaches southern Greenland, which is known for its fertile and mild climate. Depending on the season the flowers will be blooming, and you will easily understand why the Vikings chose to settle down in this beautiful area.

Today's seaport visits include Paamiut and a short stay in Narsaq, before arriving to Qaqortoq, at which point you will leave the ship and check into a local hotel for the night.

**Day 9 Reykjavik** Following a short city tour of Qaqortoq, transfer via boat through Eric's Fjord to Narsarsuaq for your flight to Reykjavik Domestic airport and overnight at the Hotel Reykjavik Natura.

**Day 10 UK** Time to squeeze in some last minute shopping or sightseeing before transferring to Keflavik for your return flight home.

# Our Spitsbergen Experiences

Follow in the footsteps of many an intrepid Arctic Circle explorer when you visit this extraordinary archipelago renowned for Polar Bears and stunning glacial landscapes. The sun never sets from April to August offering round the clock daylight experiences that will delight wildlife enthusiasts, nature lovers and those with a spirit of adventure.

Spitsbergen is the largest of Svalbard's islands and whose capital, Longyearbyen, is the most northerly point in the world served by scheduled flights.

Longyearbyen, which was once a mining town, provides a comfortable base for trips out into the wilderness. It boasts several hotels and museums whilst the population of 2000 also enjoy the unique duty free status of the islands with several hospitable bars. Also inhabited are the Russian mining town of Barentsburg and Ny Ålesund, whose proximity to the Pole has made it the departure point for many North Pole Expeditions.

Originally exploited by hunters and miners for the abundance of natural resources, National Parks and Nature Reserves now protect this largely untouched wilderness. The stunning scenery is a photographer's paradise, where the majestic scenery makes for dramatic backdrops and landscapes.

For botanists Spitsbergen offers some 200 species of flora whilst ornithologists can revel in some of the world's most spectacular birdlife including breeding colonies of Atlantic Puffin, Little Auk, Brunnich's Guillemots, Grey Phalarope (resplendent in their summer plumage), Ivory and Sabine's Gulls, Long-tailed Skua and King Elder.

If you take one of our expedition cruises partway round the archipelago, the arctic mammals are the stars of the show. This is Polar Bear country and you will have a good chance of seeing females with their cubs searching for food alongside walruses hauled out on sand banks and grazing Svalbard reindeer. Other highlights include spotting Beluga and Bowhead whales in the water as well as the elusive Arctic fox on land.





# Adventures in Spitsbergen

**Day 2 Oslo – Longyearbyen** Early morning flight from Oslo to Longyearbyen. Opportunity to stroll around this former mining town before transferring to your ship for an early evening departure out of Isfjord.

**Day 3** Zodiac along the sculpted front of the 14th of July Glacier. Brünnich's Guillemots nest, Arctic Foxes patrol and Bearded Seals cruise the fjord. Later, sail to Ny Ålesund, the launching point for many an expedition to the North Pole. Barnacle and Pink-footed Geese as well as Arctic Terns reside here.

**Day 4** Sail to the mouth of Leifdefjorden and go ashore on the tundra island of Andøya. Later, sail alongside the impressive Monaco glacier, a favourite feeding spot for thousands of Kittiwakes whilst occasional Polar Bear are spotted.

**Day 5 & 6** The northernmost landing is at Phippsøya, located in the Seven Islands north of Nordaustlandet. At 81° north, just 540 miles from the geographic North Pole, Polar Bear inhabit this region, along with Walrus and Ivory Gull. Savour the atmosphere, surrounded by pack ice, and absorb the spectacular surroundings.

Day 7 Hinlopen Strait is home to Seal, Polar Bear, and Ivory Gull. Navigate the ice floes of Lomfjordshalvøya in zodiacs. Land at Augustabukta. Explore the polar desert of Nordaustlandet, next to the world's third largest ice cap. Walk along coastline covered in smooth rocks, sculpted over thousands of years whilst possibly encountering Walrus.

**Day 8** Visit an old trapper's hut on Barentsoya, and walk across the tundra in search of reindeer. Later, land on a beach littered with whale bones as well as tree trunks, which have drifted here from Siberia. Climb to the rim of a narrow

gully where, during nesting season, the base of the cliffs is patrolled by Arctic Fox and Polar Bear.

**Day 9** Cruise the spectacular Hornsund, surrounded by towering mountain peaks. There are 14 magnificent glaciers in the area and very good chances of encounters with seals and Polar Bear.

**Day 10** At Ahlstrandhalvøya there remains piles of Beluga skeletons, a legacy of earlier exploitation. Fortunately, they can still be seen locally and there is a good chance of spotting a pod.

**Day 11** Return to Longyearbyen and disembark for the transfer to the airport and the flight home (via Oslo).

# A Viking Voyage

**Day 2 Reykjavik** Morning at leisure before afternoon embarkation. Our vessel, MS Fram, is designed for sailing in Polar waters. Carrying up to 275 passengers it is small enough to bring you closer to nature but large enough to have the comfort of a number of lounges, a gym and even jacuzzis on deck.

**Day 3 Isafjordur** First stop is the capital of the Westfjords. Isafjordur has a long history of trading and is home to Iceland's oldest dwelling. Take a stroll around the town and admire the diverse architecture.

**Day 4 At sea** As you travel across the open ocean, the on-board team of experts will conduct lectures where climate related themes will prevail.

**Day 5 Jan Mayen** Jan Mayen is dominated by the spectacular and still active 2277m volcano, Beerenberg. There are no natural harbours and alighting here is always determined by weather conditions. MS Fram and the expedition team will do their best to land on the shores of this outpost.

**Day 6 At sea** Reflect on yesterday's experiences and to prepare for Spitsbergen. On board you will learn why Spitsbergen is such a symbol for climate change and why the area is considered a global thermometer.

**Day 7 Ny-Ålesund** is one of the northernmost year-round communities and the starting point for many historical attempts to reach the North Pole. It is also the location for the most sophisticated marine laboratory in the world at this latitude. Day 8 North West Spitsbergen National Park Dependent on ice conditions MS Fram will attempt to cross the 80th parallel, something which would have been inconceivable a couple of decades ago. Keep your eyes open for Walrus, Whales and Polar Bears.

**Day 9 Isfjorden** is the largest fjord system in Spitsbergen, almost slicing the island in half. Here you can observe the giant bird cliffs. After finding a suitable bay the last expedition landing will take place followed by a special party, the 'Polar Barbeque", on the deck of MS Fram.

**Day 10 Longyearbyen** The capital of Svalbard has around 2000 inhabitants and is very much an Arctic outpost. Even so, it has modern amenities such as a hospital, school, university and power plant. The University Centre is focused on natural sciences conducting several prestige projects. Self-transfer to Trappers Lodge for 2 nights.

**Day 11 Longyearbyen** Day at leisure to further explore and participate in a number of additional excursions - see page 22.

**Day 12 UK** Enjoy your final morning in this absorbing region before your return flight to the UK (via Oslo).



Day 2 Bergen Day at leisure to explore this vibrant and colourful Hanseatic town. Take the funicular 'Fløibanen' for fantastic views over Bergen.

**Day 3 Bergensbanen** Today you will embark on a tour that showcases the best of this scenic region as well as two of the most notable train journeys. Depart from Bergen by taking the train to Voss. Continue by bus to Gudvangen via the spectacular 13 hairpin bends of Stalheimsleiva. At Gudvangen a fjord cruise takes you across the Aurland & Naerøyfjords to Flåm where you board the Flåm Railway. **Day 1 UK – Bergen** Fly to Bergen and we will arrange a private transfer to your hotel, the Clarion Collection Havnekontoret, located by the UNESCO World Heritage site of Bryggen, for 1 night.

**Day 2 Bergen and Hurtigruten** You have the day to enjoy Bergen, where there are so many sightseeing opportunities within easy walking distance of the city centre including the Fish Market, the Funicular railway to Mt. Fløyen and Bryggen. Self-transfer to the Hurtigruten quayside for the early evening sailing out through the skerry littered archipelago. Accommodation in chosen cabin, breakfast, lunch and dinner included throughout the sailing.

**Day 3 Ålesund & Geiranger** A morning arrival in the beautiful town of Ålesund, famed for its Art Nouveau buildings. Early evening arrival at Svolvaer, the capital of the Lofoten Islands. The landscape here is dominated by jagged peaks and, white sandy beaches and a coastline dotted with small red Rorbuer (Fisherman Cottages) and StockFish racks. There is a choice of excursions including a worthy visit to the Viking Museum.

Temperatures in the Nordic countries and Northern Europe can vary considerably from day to day or even in a day and conditions can change unexpectedly and rapidly; the terrain is often hazardous and ground conditions frequently difficult. You should take suitable clothing with these conditions in mind particularly good quality wind/rain proof outerwear; strong walking shoes or boots, gloves and sufficient and varied clothes to enable you to 'layer up'. Many of our tours, particularly in lceland and Greenland, involve walking or medium grade hiking and you may find it useful to invest in a good pair of boots, broken in well before departure. If you're in any doubt as to what to take, we're always happy to talk it through with you.

#### YOUR TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

We will normally send all your travel documents and itineraries to either yourself or your travel agent approximately two to three weeks before your departure. PLEASE check them carefully. In some cases, the timings may have changed from those on your holiday confirmation, and the correct timings will appear on the tickets themselves, or on accompanying documentation.

#### **TOUR PRICES**

Full details of what is included in the price of your tour are shown in the panel on the relevant tour page. Prices are per person based on two people sharing a room unless otherwise specified and include all applicable taxes and mandatory charges. This brochure was published in 2014. Prices can change according to availability and seasonality and will be reconfirmed at the time of booking by way of a Confirmation Invoice.



#### 1. WHEN BOOKING

When you make your booking you must complete a booking form, accepting on behalf of all your party the terms of these booking conditions, and pay the appropriate deposit. If booking through Travel Agent all monies paid to that agent are held by them on our behalf at all times. A contract will exist as soon as we issue our confirmation invoice. This contract is made on the terms of these booking conditions, which are governed by English Law, and the jurisdiction of the English Courts. You may however, choose the law and jurisdiction of Scotland or Northern Ireland if you wish to do so.

#### 2. PAYING YOUR BALANCE

The balance of the price of your tour must be paid at least ten weeks before your departure date. If the balance is not paid in time we reserve the right to cancel your tour, retain your deposit, and apply the cancellation charges set out in paragraph 4 below.

#### 3. AMENDING YOUR BOOKING

If, after our confirmation has been issued, you wish to change to another of our tours or change the departure date, we will endeavour to make any such change, provided the request to do so is received in writing from the person who signed the booking form or from your Travel Agent at least ten weeks before departure. This must be accompanied by a payment of  $\pounds 50$  to cover administration costs. Alterations cannot normally be made within ten weeks of departure and any such request for an alteration will be treated as a cancellation of the original booking and subject to the cancellation charges set out in paragraph 4 below. Please note that certain travel arrangements cannot be changed after a reservation has been made and any alteration will then incur a 100% cancellation charge and be treated as a new booking.

#### 4. IF YOU CANCEL YOUR BOOKING

You, or any member of your party, may cancel your tour at any time providing that the cancellation is made by the person signing the booking form and is received by us in writing. As this incurs administrative costs, we will retain your deposit and apply cancellation charges up to the maximum below:

#### 5. PROBLEMS

If you have a problem during your holiday, please inform the relevant supplier (e.g. hotelier, excursion operator, etc.) immediately, who will endeavour to put things right on our behalf. If your complaint is not resolved locally, please follow this up within 28 days of your return home by writing to us at 39 Crouch Street, Colchester CO3 3EN giving your booking reference and other relevant information to help us identify the problem(s) you encountered. It is strongly recommended you communicate any complaint to the supplier of the services in question and if possible keep a written account of having done so. If you fail to follow this simple procedure we will have been deprived of the opportunity to investigate and rectify your complaint whilst you were on tour and this may affect your rights under this contract

As members of ABTA (membership number W879X) we are obliged to maintain a high standard of service to you by ABTA's Code of Conduct and it is unlikely that you will have a complaint that cannot be settled amicably between us. However, disputes arising out of, or in connection with, this contract which cannot be amicably settled may be referred to arbitration under a special scheme which is arranged by ABTA and administered independently. It is a simple and inexpensive method of arbitration on documents alone with restricted liability on you for costs. The upper limit on claims is £5,000 per person and £25,000 per booking form. The scheme doesn't apply to claims which are solely in respect of physical injury or illness of their consequences. It can however deal with claims which include an element of minor injury or illness subject to a limit of  $\pounds1,500$  on the amount the arbitrator can award per person in respect of this element. You request for arbitration must be received by ABTA within eighteen months of the date of return from holiday. For injury and illness claims, you can request the ABTA Mediation Procedure and we have the option to agree to mediation. Further information on the Code and ABTA's assistance in resolving disputes can be found on www.abta.com.

#### 6. SURCHARGES

We reserve the right to alter the prices of any arrangement featured in our brochure or on our website. You will be advised of the current price of any arrangement you wish to book before your contract is confirmed.

Changes in transportation costs, including fuel costs, taxes or fees chargeable for services such as landing taxes or embarkation or disembarkation fees at ports and airports and exchange rates mean that the price of your travel arrangements may change after you have booked, but there will be no change within 30 days of your departure.

However we will absorb and you will not be charged for any increase equivalent to 2% of the price of your travel arrangements, which excludes insurance premiums and any amendment charges. You will be charged for the amount over and above that, plus an administration charge of £1.00 per person together with an amount

to cover agents' commission if applicable. If this means that you would have to pay an increase of more than 10% of the price of your travel arrangements, you will have the option of accepting a change to another arrangement if we are able to offer one (if this is of equivalent or higher quality you will not have to pay more but if it is of lower quality you will be refunded the difference in price), or cancelling and receiving a full refund of all monies paid, except for any amendment charges. #### 7. CANCELLATION AND VARIATION TO ARRANGEMENTS

It is unlikely that we will have to make any changes to your arrangements, but we do plan them many months in advance. Occasionally changes occur, but most are minor, and we will advise you or your travel agent at the earliest possible date. Flight timings and carriers in the brochure are subject to change as a result of airline procedures. Final details will be shown on your tickets and/or in the accompanying documentation. If a majo change becomes necessary, we will inform you or your travel agent as soon as reasonably possible if there is time before departure. When a major change occurs (such as the alteration of your outward/return flights by more than 12 hours, changes of hotel or a reduction in the standard of accommodation), provided it does not arise from circumstances amounting to force majeure (see below), you will have the choice of either accepting the change taking another available arrangement from us, or cancelling your arrangement and receiving a full refund. In the interests of our clients, we reserve the right to cancel itineraries, or to substitute alternative accommodation, if the arrangement, unamended, would then in our opinion suffer, or be in some way impracticable However, in no case will we cancel your arrangement less than ten weeks before the scheduled departure date except for reasons of force majeure or failure on your part to pay the final balance (circumstances amounting to force majeure include war, the threat of war, riot, civil strife, industrial dispute, terrorist activity, natural or nuclear disaster, fire, adverse weather conditions, or withdrawal of suppliers facilities) We may cancel your holiday before this date if e.g. the minimum number of clients required for a particular travel arrangement is not reached. However we will not be liable where any failure in the performance of the contract is due to either you or a third party unconnected with the provision of the travel arrangements and where the failure was unforeseeable or unavoidable; or unusual and unforeseeable circumstances beyond our control, the consequences of which could not have been avoided even if all due care had been exercised; or an event which we or our suppliers, even with all due care, could not foresee or forestall. Our liability, except in cases involving death, injury or illness will be limited in accordance with and/or in an identical manner to (a) The contractual terms of the companies that provide the transportation for your travel arrangements and (b) Any relevant international convention, for example the Montreal Convention in respect of travel by air, the Athens Convention in respect of travel by sea, the Berne Convention in respect of travel by rail and the Paris Convention in respect of the provision of accommodation, which limit the amount of compensation that you can claim for death,

injury, delay to passengers and loss, damage and delay to luggage. We are to be regarded as having all benefit of any limitation of compensation contained in these or any conventions.

When on any tour featured in this brochure you agree to abide by any advice given by our accompanying courier and/or any of our agents locally. You further accept and agree to accept your responsibility as being 'in loco parentis' for any children under the age of majority travelling with you and appearing on your Booking Form. In respect of all safaris, excursions and activities you further accept responsibility both for yourself and any accompanying children for listening and/or reading instructions given to you both on usage of equipment (including but not limited to equipment used in connection with animals), health and safety.

#### **10. ASSISTANCE WHILST ON TOUR**

If the contract we have with you is not performed or is improperly performed as a result of failures attributable to a third party connected with the provision of the services, or as a result of failures due to unusual and unforeseeable circumstances beyond our control, the consequences of which could not have been avoided even if all due care had been exercised, or an event which we or our suppliers, even with all due care, could not foresee or forestall, and you suffer an injury or other material loss, we will offer you such prompt assistance as is reasonable in the circumstances.
